There's room in the Kingdom for all who seek, for all who knock, for all who ask (Matthew 7:7).


## One Great Hour Of Sharing Offering

On Volunteerism

Ann Pepple is a welcome face at Franke Park Elementary School where she worked 12 years in special education. She has spent an additional 6 years volunteering every Monday and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. in a second grade class. Her teacher is retiring this year so Ann has also decided to retire. A special memory is of Tickles, the turtle. Each class has an animal. Tickles had to be fed by an eye dropper. After 28 years, it is still there in her classroom. Ann's favorite meal is steak with sweet potato at Logan's Steakhouse.

Beth and Jack Green are both volunteers at the Gene Stratton Porter restored home. They give tours and serve at the special Christmas open house. Beth assists with special tea parties. Jack serves as an outdoor guide and helps with the wild game cookout. Jack also walks dogs weekly at the Humane Shelter. Both Jack and Beth help with the library book sales three times a year and also help in the church food bank. Switta Thai is a favorite restaurant of the Greens where they often enjoy the Rama chicken and broccoli served in a peanut sauce over a bed of rice.

Marilu Brunson spends every Monday reading five local newspapers to the blind for the downtown library. Twice a month she also reads poetry. Her time and effort is appreciated by over 3,500 disabled and blind folks. The radio station offers programming 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Other volunteers also read a wide variety of magazines. Marilu's constant buddy is Jada, a rescue poodle. Jada enjoys

spending time in the car and gets treats from the bank and at McDonald's. Other hobbies of Marilu are playing the accordion, going to Curves, and water aerobics class. Her favorite restaurant is Cracker Barrel where all ages can order off the children's menu. Marilu always orders shrimp and carrots.

Becky Morris gives her time to third graders at the Embassy Theater. They tour the whole building, starting in the old Hotel Lobby. This is a study field trip where the kids answer questions on the history of the building while learning about community volunteers that saved this most beautiful building. After traipsing through the whole building, the kids participate in a skit on the stage area and hear the organ being played. Becky enjoys a meal of steak and sweet potatoes at the Texas Roadhouse.

Darwin Sievers also volunteers at the Embassy. He gets to play that gigantic organ! One song he always plays is "Bicycle Built for Two," and he also demonstrates a wide variety of sound effects. Darwin enjoys a special meal of roast beef dinner at the Essenhaus in Middlebury.

Vicki Welch gives her free time teaching swimming lessons to disabled children from Turnstone. Ages vary from 3 years old through teens. The program is run by a physical therapist to teach skills, socialization, fun, and physical strength. The kids "compete" against themselves and receive ribbons at the end of the sessions when they have a big party with firemen and a radio deejay. Vicki prefers the grilled fish, steamed veggies, and gluten free bread at Biaggi's.

The above volunteers all know their efforts are appreciated. As they willingly give their time, they touch the lives of many souls.
