

Peter wrote in his first New Testament letter, "Always be prepared to give answer to everyone who asks you to give reason for the hope that you have," (I Peter 3:15/NIV). He did not write that to a select few Christians. His letter was

directed toward, "God's elect," (I Peter I:I) wherever they might be, or whatever their status in the church. So we

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



Love fund Report

The Love Fund, which is managed by Pastor Jeff and the deacons, was established as a quick monetary resource available for those who need assistance for food, shelter, utilities, transportation, or other situations deemed worthy. Through the years we have helped hundreds of people through our association with the Community Harvest Food Bank where we supply a \$19 voucher and they choose 100 pounds of food. We have also established a Walmart gift card system for helping those who need fuel, groceries, or supplies at \$25 per family. Additional needs are granted upon a decision by the pastor and deacons when a larger amount is needed for rent, utilities, transportation, etc. A limit of \$100 per family per year was established so that we could help as many different people as possible.

Our income is through **donations**, through both offering designations and the Quarter Bank. Since the beginning of 2013, we emptied the Quarter Bank for a total of \$129.44. We have helped 3 families at the Community Harvest Food Bank for a total expenditure of \$57. We have a balance of \$853.43 in our account. **Thanks to those who contribute to this fund.**

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
