A Personal Note and a Joint Reflection

This note is one that I find hard to write, because it involves acknowledging that I have made a difficult decision that marks an end to some very important things in my life. For the past 34 years my waking up and my going to sleep each day and night have occurred in the context of serving a beloved Brethren congregation. I have awakened each day to ministry, and I have gone to sleep each night knowing myself to be immersed in that service. My life schedule has revolved around the needs of the church. A significant part of my identity has been tied to serving as an active, full-time pastor.

Come January I, 2014 that ends. I will then be a retired pastor. That doesn't mean that all ministry ends at that point. There are many ways to remain in ministry, but having that special relationship with a congregation that comes from being their pastor will no longer be my experience. Certainly I will miss that, even though I recognize that every pastor must eventually reach the point where God says to them what I perceive God has said to me: "Okay, let go now! I have other things in mind for you from here on."

I want to thank all Agapians for calling me to be your pastor for the past 6 plus years. You have been a wonderful and supportive congregation. Being your pastor, as I wrote to the District Executive some weeks ago, is "an honor not easily relinquished." Agape is an exciting congregation to pastor with its

diverse musical talent, its skilled leadership, and its committed members. I feel fortunate to have been the pastor of this congregation for more than 6 years.

As we look to the future, we'll all continue serving the same Lord, just in different circumstances. Whatever the circumstances, I believe we can trust that as the apostle Paul asserted, "neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord," (Romans 8:38-39/NIV). That love keeps us bound together, wherever we are, and whatever our circumstances.

As we look ahead, let's enjoy working together in the time we have remaining. lesus is our common Lord, the time is His gift to us, and His service is what we're all about. One of my grandsons coined a new word recently, "benext." He said it when he was trying to indicate the places that all of his stuffed animals were located in. "They're 'benext' to one another, Grandpa," he said; by which he meant that they were either between one another, or next to one another. Wherever the days ahead lead us, all Agapians and Connie and I, we will always, as my grandson said, be "benext" to one another, in spirit and in Christ.

Thanks to those who have been teaching through the fall months. We appreciate the teachers and helpers who share God's word with our children.

We are now looking toward the winter quarter of our year, and need those who will commit to teaching/helping through December, January, and February. We have the materials, and the theme is "Meeting Jesus the Messiah: Stories from John" which takes us through the Advent season, Christmas, and then tells stories of Jesus. Agape's Love Fund

The need continues as Pastor Jeff has been fielding a number of people with help for food, utility assistance, fuel, etc. We offer vouchers to the Community Harvest Food Bank which allows a person to choose 100 pounds of food, and we pay CHFB \$19. Pastor leff also has \$25 scrip Wal-Mart cards that can be used for food, fuel, paper goods, and supplies. We have dropin persons who ask for help with rent, utilities, or travel needs at times. The Deacon's Love Fund pays for all of these needs for those people who qualify for assistance, and it usually stays well over the \$1000 mark, but has dropped to \$612 currently. Prayerfully consider dropping quarters in the bank or making a Love Fund donation.

Food Bank is in need of the following items:

Cereal, saltine crackers, hamburger helpers, dish soap, bar soap, evaporated milk, toilet paper, shampoo, chicken and dumplings, beef stew, dried beans, rice, canned fruit, tuna, and mac and cheese.

When you shop, remember to purchase some of these needed items for the food bank. It would be greatly appreciated!
