I wrote this poem about Love Feast in 2007:

But Jesus looks at me with love. Eventually, I say. "You may serve me" Have you ever wondered just what it is about us that makes us want to be the one who gives instead of the one who receives?

I think it is pride. In John 13, Jesus comes to wash Peter's feet and Peter refuses because Jesus is Lord and Master and Peter is merely the student. Jesus tells Peter that if he is too proud to be served then he can have no part of God's kingdom.

We are people who both give grace and receive grace. And the mystery is that if we do not receive it, if we are not willing to receive it without any means of paying back, then we are not able to give it.

Here is the lesson I learn in this mystery: It all comes from God. Ephesians 2:8-9: "For by grace you have been saved through faith and this is the gift of God. It is not by works. Otherwise, we would have reason to boast..."

The charity support families, immediately after learning of the loss of their loved one and provides scholarships to their children to attend university. Both charities need our support and is a way to honor our fathers who are with us now or with our Father in heaven.
